

Our Practice of Close Communion	Communing
 A Holy Sacrament - Holy Communion is correctly called a 'Sacrament' because it is a "Sacred act;" not in what WE do for Christ, but in what CHRIST does for us. Spiritual Unity - God's Word also presents the reception of this Sacrament as a most intimate expression of spiritual and confessional unity (1 Cor. 1:10; 10:16- 17; Rom. 15:5,6). Close Communion - We ask only those who have publicly professed such oneness of faith and belief with us by membership here or another CLC church to come forward for Communion at this time. This is not a judgment of anyone's faith, but rather an expression of ours (Rom. 16:17- 18). Visitors - If there are visitors present who wish to commune with us in the future, you are invited to speak with the pastor about this at your convenience. We'd love to have you! 	 Kneeling rail - Members who have difficulty at the kneeling rail may sit in the front pews. The pastor will bring communion to you there. Balcony - Any communicants sitting in the balcony should please come down to the narthex for direction to the table. Direction - Communicants are ushered to the communion table. If you desire the bread in your hand, simply extend your hand to the pastor as he approaches you with the bread. Those desiring an individual cup, please take a cup when the tray is offered. The common cup will follow. Gluten Free Bread / Non-alcoholic Wine - Communicants can find these items on the way up to the Lord's Table. Cup disposal - Please dispose of your individual cup in the baskets located on each side or in the center aisle.

THE OPPORTUNITY

In July 2005 the congregation created an "Expansion Relocation Committee" (ERC). The ERC through the last twenty years has completed some important work, but early on in July 2006 they determined that the first phase would be to acquire suitable property.

Recently a property was made available to Immanuel for purchase. 32± acres in upper North Mankato, in city limits with utilities available and no assessments. The Church Council secured a six-month period for exclusive purchase rights. So now what?

OUR MISSION

Before we sign the dotted line for a land purchase, we should be unified in our congregations role for the Mankato area. The talents and people we have been blessed with for over 158 years have helped build colleges, a hospital, a seminary and the K-12 school that have strived to serve the Lord as prescribed in Matthew 28.

What do we wish to accomplish in our next 20 years? Education has been a cornerstone of this congregation since the beginning, does this opportunity help in this mission?
